Legal Immigrants and HUSKY: How to apply

Legal immigrants can sign up for HUSKY. You cannot be deported for applying, and your name *will not* be given to "immigration", also known as the "INS".

To apply for HUSKY:



- Fill out and sign a HUSKY application
- Write down your family income (The HUSKY program may ask for income papers later.)
- You only need to show immigration papers for people in the family if they are:
 - applying for HUSKY *and*
 - are *not* citizens
- If you are applying *only* for US citizen children, you do *not* need to show *any* immigration papers. Children born in the United States are citizens, and can get HUSKY.
- Only write down the Social Security numbers for people who are applying for HUSKY
- Write down how much you pay for child care costs
- HUSKY may ask for information about your sponsor and their income. The state may ask a sponsor to pay them back for the cost of your HUSKY benefits. **You will not be deported for applying.**

You do ***not*** need:

- child's birth certificate
- papers about bank accounts, cars, motorcycles, boats, houses
